Checkpoint Results

Checkpoint Results were released on Thursday, 22 June 2023, and a brief ceremony was held from 1.30 to 2.30 pm in Kesselring Hall for the Year 6 and Year 9 students, and their families. Seven students from Year 6 and four students from Year 9 obtained the highest possible performance band of 'Outstanding' for all three subjects: Mathematics, Science and English. Four other students from Year 6 and one from Year 9 obtained 'Outstanding' in two of the three subjects taken. Congratulations to all the Year 6 and Year 9 students on their results!

For information purposes, Cambridge introduced new performance bands for Checkpoint that went into effect from January 2023. This means that from the May 2023 Cambridge Checkpoint series, both primary and lower secondary reports will show a score on a 0-50 scale (rather than on a 0.0-6.0 scale as before). A comparative look at how both scoring systems stack up against each other is shown on the right.

HIPPO - Achievement Awards

Wesley students this academic year, also participated in a variety of international assessments to see where they stand compared to their peers around the world. Among these assessments were:

1. **HIPPO** - The Hippo English Language Olympiad is a competition meant to encourage the use of the English Language at the international level. Students around the world compete in tests of listening and writing skills.
2. **ICAS** (International Competitions and Assessments for Schools) - ICAS is a suite of online competitions designed to recognize and reward academic excellence at every year level. It is administered in over 20 countries around the world. Knowledge and/or skills tested are in Digital Technologies, English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Writing.

Junior School Field Trip

Students from the Junior School embarked on a school trip to Kuala Sepetang on 12 July 2023. They explored the fascinating world of charcoal production at the local factory, witnessing the traditional methods employed by skilled craftsmen. Afterwards, they ventured into the enchanting mangrove swamp, marvelling at the diverse ecosystems within and learning about the swamp's role in the environment.

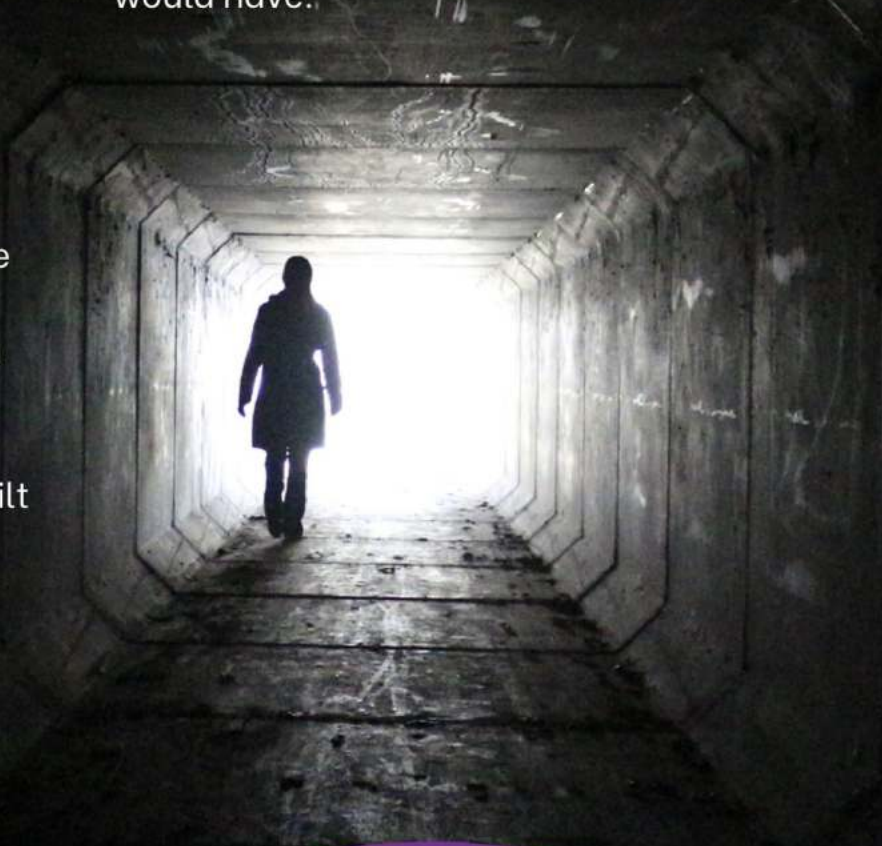

The train ride was a pleasant experience for us all.

After arriving at KL Central, we were greeted by the coordinator of the event and hopped onto the bus. The trip continued with us taking a trip to the hotel to pick up the directors of the Choir. When they came up on to the bus, they greeted all of us personally, introducing themselves. Shortly after, we arrived at the Selangor Institute of Music (SIM) where our workshop would be held. Refreshments were served with some hot drinks. Then we went upstairs for the first session of the workshop.

The first session of the workshop was vocal warmups with the directors. It was an eye-opening session with many techniques to aid us in singing better. But out of them all, my personal favourite was singing "I Like the Flowers" by Beat Boppers Children's Music as after a few rounds of practising it, we were split into four groups and started singing the song at different intervals. This created a melodious sound that brightened the atmosphere of the room. It taught us that as we sing, we need to put effort into memorizing the lyrics of the songs and at the same time be able to sing in key together as a team.

After an hour, we went downstairs for a 30-minute break with refreshments. It was also during then that the choir group started arriving one by one and we all used that as an opportunity to get to know them. They were all friendly people.



The second session of the workshop was the directors teaching us the two songs with lots of helpful techniques on how we could improve to make it sound better. We were all divided into groups of those who sang Soprano, Alto, Tenor, and Bass. Whenever there was a slight error in the singing, the director would patiently guide us group by group using different techniques that everyone could understand. This made it easier for us all to sing the songs without making it a difficult task. We learned the songs part by part before trying it all together collectively, giving us the opportunity to hear them come to life. We got to enjoy lunch downstairs. It was a vegetarian lunch with all kinds of dishes. We all got to sit with the choir group to get to know each other even more.

Session 3 of the workshop was a time for the choir group to have their rehearsals for the upcoming tour in KL and Australia. It was a surreal experience seeing them all perform. With minor tweaks made by the director as they rehearsed, it made the songs sound better each time. We were all awed by the beautiful melody that came out song after song. It was definitely a moment that we all tried our best to soak in. After some time, we got to take a break with more refreshments and meaningful conversations.

The last session was a question and answer (Q&A) session with the director and the performance of the two songs together with the choir. The question and answer session was really informative for us all and a great platform for us to get to know more about choir singing and the schedule of the choir group. We were all looking forward to the opportunity of performing together with the choir.

With that, the workshop came to an end. We all said our goodbyes and got dropped off at NU Central for dinner and later walked to KL Central to catch the train back to Ipoh. The train left exactly at 7.03 pm and departed for Ipoh. On the train ride back, we were all exhausted but grateful for the experience we had had. We reflected on our experiences over a conversation filled with laughter, with the sun setting. When we arrived back in Ipoh, our parents picked us all up and we went back home.

This was an unforgettable experience for us all as we got the privilege of meeting and learning from one of the most famous Chamber Choirs in the world. We are definitely excited to put to use the knowledge we learned from the workshop in practice.



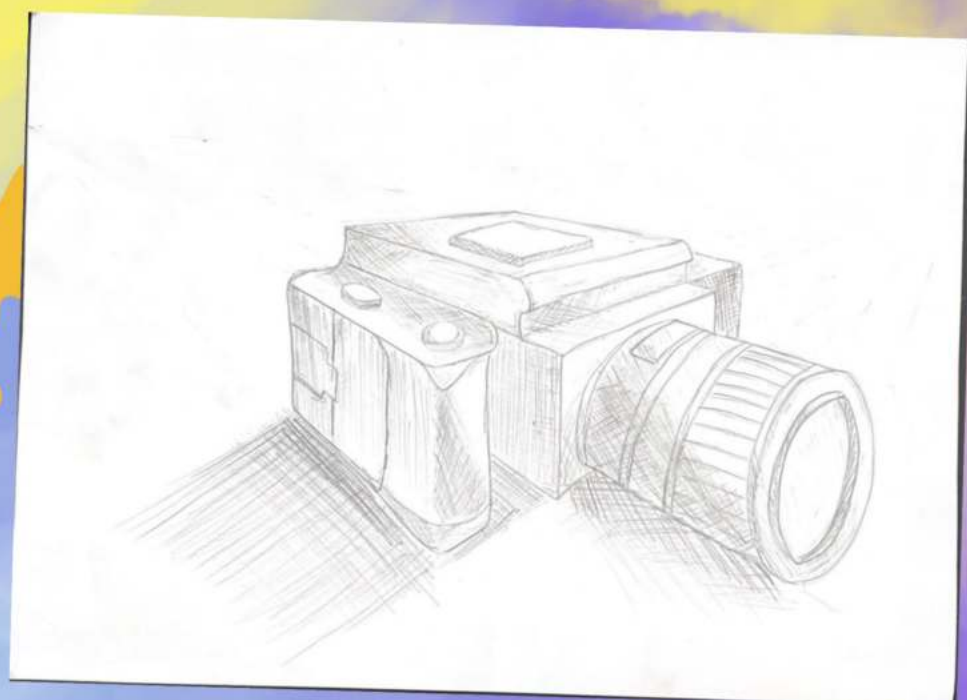

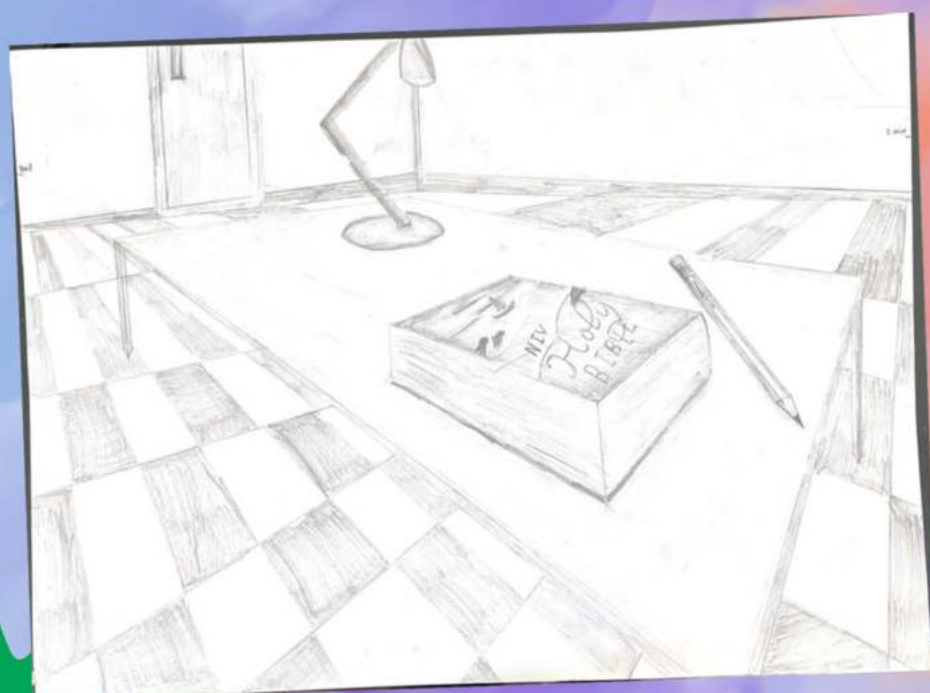
